The children will conclude the Lent Sunday school rotation (*Meals of Blessing*) with their traditional and annual Easter Happening which is planned for April 6 during Sunday school. They will have an hour to move from classroom to classroom to make the fun Easter crafts together! This year's crafts are: A Holy Week Good Friday Clock Wheel, The Holy Week Hanging Decorative Door Hanger, Color Your Own Easter Cross stand-up, and The Easter Butterfly kit. And I'm still working on a special craft for them! The children love it and so do the teachers and I. You would be surprised how fast they can make crafts! They go home with arms full of Easter treasures that make mom and dad smile with pride. The sweet crafts really do become treasures. Ask any of the parents of children (now adults) who have attended the Happenings. I still have a few treasures of my own that my daughter made me! The crafts will not only be fun to make, but they will remind the children of the events of Holy Week. Last week they made their own garden!

The next Sunday school rotation that begins on April 6 will get them ready for Easter when we can all rejoice saying, "He has risen! He has risen, indeed"! They will learn the Easter story from the "Resurrection Eggs" which are a dozen colorful plastic Easter Eggs that contain small objects (such as three coins, a small donkey, a small cup, small praying hands, a small crown of thorns, a small die, a small piece off linen/gauze, a stone and 1 EMPTY egg). The Resurrection Eggs tell the Bible stories that reveal the meaning of each object to help them understand the Easter Story.



The children's traditional Easter Egg Hunt is planned for Easter Morning, April 20, during the church worship service. I'm collecting Easter Candy that will fill the inside of many plastic Easter Eggs which will be hidden by the Youth Group! Donations of Easter candy are always appreciated. Candy

donations may be brought to the church office or to Sunday school. Thank you in advance for supporting the Christian Education programs.




Youth Group Easter Candy Sale
